

It's an evening of music and dance and foot-stomping you won't want to miss! Welcome back two old board members: **Nick Dale** is back as our new Vice President. And **Celina Wood** is back in her old position, Board Secretary.



# **Best Wishes for Memphis Gold**



**Memphis Gold** has come a long way in his short 14 year tenure in the Mid Atlantic, including the crowning achievement of recording 4 CD's. Along with being a great musician, he also has a great heart and genuine love for people. On Tuesday, January 8, misfortune visited this great man with a terrible accident.

The day of his accident found him doing what he does when not playing the blues and that was trimming a tree. He was finishing up the last of his trees around 3:15 p.m. His wife **Barbara** and his crew were there, and before you blink an eye, Memphis was falling. His injuries included a punctured lung, broken back and the loss of the feeling in his feet. He is presently going through his first eight weeks of aggressive therapy and shows great promise.

Writing songs while not in therapy is keeping him occupied. His guitar is posted within his reach by his bedside. His spirits are kept up by his visits from his wife Barbara, his sister **Missionary Ruth Sanders** (who flew in from Memphis), sons, nephews, fellow musicians and fans.

# What members of our community say about Memphis Gold:

**Bobby Parker** says, "Allot of cats [other musicians] won't even talk to you." Bobby has known Memphis for at least 20 years, and considers him a real good friend. He describes Memphis as an even tempered man and is easy to get along with on any given day. Bobby says they were about launch their tour in Indianapolis in April.



When speaking to the DCBS President **Felix Mclairen** about Memphis he says, "I like that kinda raw soufulness that he brings to the audience. He has an honest style and has an ebullient stage presence." The society has been fortunate to have him perform at our functions.

**Carl Gray**, a drummer who has been currently working with him, tells me the story on how they met. Carl says, "We met over a stack on pancakes in IHOP and talked for hours". Carl filmed Memphis at the Marine Corps Marathon last year and feels like he has known Memphis and wife Barbara all his life. "Anything I can do for him I will", says Carl.

**Nadine Rae** says, "MEMPHIS GOLD is America's best kept secret! His smile, and humble spirit, along with his vibrant attitude—both musically and otherwise, "I am pleased to know Memphis Gold as one of the area's finest blues artists, but more importantly as a really wonderful person."

## From TN to DC: The Memphis Gold Story



Memphis Gold (née Chester Chandler) was born on March 4, 1955 in Memphis Tennessee, to John and Reada Chandler, thirteenth in a line of fourteen. Right from the start, spirituality infused into Chester's blood, for it was at the Memphis Church of God in Christ where he found his first musical influences. In fact, his grandfather helped

found the denomination in the 1800's. Chester's father John played bass fiddle and piano there, and he introduced his son to the guitar at the age of four. By age eight, Chester was already well known on Beale Street, where he performed on the street for pocket change, and in the church for his congregation.

the mid-Sixties, Reverend Robert "Tim" Wilkins arrived at the Church of God in Christ. Wilkins was a former Blues musician who came back to Gospel after witnessing a brutal bar fight in 1935. He was fairly well-known for "That's No Way to Get Along" and "Old Jim Canan's"—two seminal songs that were revived in the Sixties by the Rolling Stones and Led Zeppellin. Reverend Robert Wilkins



mentored several great Blues musicians (**Son House** being his most notable protégé,) and when Chester was 12,

Wilkins took him under his wing. Memphis Gold eventually paid tribute to his former mentor with his 2005 album *Prodigal Son*.

Chester joined the Navy during the Vietnam War and served for a decade. His experiences so far from home has left him with an affinity the men and women who serve our country. Subsequently, Memphis Gold joins USO tours as a way of giving comfort to them. When his



enlistment was over, Chester went back to playing the Blues. He frequently played with the **Fieldstones**, but also gigged with the likes of **Little Milton** and **B.B. King**.

In 1995, he married his wife **Barbara** and moved to the Washington, DC area. Here is where he adopted the stage name Memphis Gold, and here is when his career took off. He has appeared onstage with an astonishing list of artists, from **James Brown** to **Martha and the Vandellas**. He has partnered with fellow Blues legends **Charlie Sayles** and **Bobby Parker** to form Memphis Gold Productions. He has released four CD's, most notably the highly critically acclaimed *Prodigal Son*. He frequents the Westminster Presbytarian Monthly Blues Jam. He is an active member of the DC Blues Society, headlining the DCBS Annual Blues Festival in 2006.

On January 4, 2008 Chester was derailed by an accident. He fell while trimming a tree on his P.G. County property, and fractured his vertebrae. His friends and fans in the Washington area wish him a speedy recovery, and we hope to see him performing again soon..

At least nine people are extremely grateful that Memphis Gold made the Washington, D.C. area his home. During the President's Day blizzard in February, 1996, he rescued nine Job Corps students from a train wreck just outside Silver Spring, MD. Those kids knew Memphis Gold too—he happened to have performed a Blues seminar for them just a few months before!

# The Blues Foundation Announces Nominees for the 2008 Blues Music Awards

The Blues Foundation will present the Blues Music Awards for the first time in their 29-year history in the Mississippi Delta, the birthplace of the Blues. Performers, industry representatives and fans from around the globe will celebrate the best in Blues recording and performance from the previous year on May 8, 2008 at the Grand Casino Event Center in Tunica Resorts, Mississippi, just down the road from Memphis, the Awards' home since their 1980 inception.

Among those heading the list of the honorees is Mississippi favorite son **Bobby Rush** who garnered four nominations, including another historical first—nomination as Artist of the Year in both the Acoustic and Soul Blues categories. This singular achievement stems from the nominators' recognition of the two personas exhibited in his 2007 public performances—some shows featuring his long-running soul revue while others found him alone with a guitar and a harmonica in support of his Acoustic Album of the Year nominee *Raw*.

Watermelon Slim & the Workers returned in force, securing six nominations for the second consecutive year on the strength of their Album of Year candidate *The Wheel Man*. The "Queen of the Blues" Koko Taylor returns to form with four nominations, including one for her Album of the Year nominee *Old School*. The other artists with Album of the Year selections rode them to three nominations apiece, including *On the Jimmy Reed Highway* by Omar Kent Dykes & Jimmie Vaughan; Bettye LaVette's Blues News continues on P. 9

The Scene of the Crime; Nick Moss & the Flip Tops' Play It 'Til Tomorrow; My Life, My Friends, My Music by Sugar Ray & the Bluetones; and James Blood Ulmer's Bad Blood in the City. Lurrie Bell also was honored with three nominations, including one he shares with his late father Carey in the newly-created DVD category.

Online voting begins December 13 for members. Voting, ticket and host hotel information can be found at The Blues Foundation's website—www.blues.org.

The Blues Music Awards are universally recognized as the highest honor given to Blues artists. The Blues Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and Charter Members' Dinner will be held the night before on Wednesday, May 7 at the Tunica RiverPark museum situated on the banks of the Mississippi River. The 2008 inductees will be announced early next year.

### **Bob Enos R.I.P.**

**Bob Enos**, longtime trumpet player for **Roomful of Blues**, died in his sleep in his hotel room in Douglas, Georgia, early Friday morning, January 11, 2008 of suspected heart failure. He was 60. Roomful is continuing its current tour with former band member **John Wolfe** taking Enos's place.

Enos joined Roomful Of Blues in September, 1981. Only saxophonist **Rich Lataille** had been with the band longer. He appeared on every album that Roomful made apart from its first three releases, including a new CD, *Raisin' A Ruckus*, set to be released on January 15, 2008. Enos can also be heard with the Roomful horn section on recordings by **Pat Benatar**, **Stevie Ray Vaughan**, **Colin James**, **Jimmy "T99" Nelson** and others. Influenced by **Louis Armstrong** and **Roy Eldridge**, Enos' driving delivery and punching high notes put a sparkle atop the

Roomful horn section and frequently drew gasps from the audience.

Born in Boston, Massachusetts, on July 4, 1947, Bob took up the trumpet at age 14, studied at the Boston Conservatory of Music, and spent the late sixties and early seventies playing in R&B and soul bands. After studying with **John Coffee** and **Ray Copeland**, he spent two of years working with the legendary **Platters** (led by **Herb Reed**) before joining **Jack Radcliffe and the New Viper Revue**. He then founded the award-winning band **Channel One** and was with this jazz fusion group for three years. After a period of freelance work he joined Roomful, literally on the eve of the band's first coast-to-coast tour.


